

Dr. Ling-Qun Hu is a full professor of clinical anesthesiology and anesthesiologist at The Ohio State University Wexner Medical Center, the founder and director of the OSU Anesthesiology Research Hub, the Research Director of the Obstetric Anesthesia Division.

He is the founder and executive director of No Pain Labor & Delivery - Global Health Initiative (NPLD-GHI), and the Head of the American Anesthesiology Research Fellowship of World Federation of Anesthesiologists. (WFSA), President-Emeritus of the Society of Chinese American Physician Entrepreneurs (SCAPE), supervisor for Medical Student Anesthesia Research Fellowships (MSARF) of American Society of Anesthesiologists - Foundation of Anesthesia Education and Research (FAER), Academic Development Mentor of the Society of Obstetric Anesthesia and Perinatology (SOAP), and leadership positions of many American and international societies or outreaching programs. He went to China, India, and Ecuador many times. His NPLD-GHI has been recognized by many American academic institutes, professional societies, and WHO for its outcome improvements systematically.

Graduated from Zhejiang Medical University (now Zhejiang University School of Medicine) in 1984, trained and worked as an internist in China for his first 10 years; participated in the preparation of the current "Canadian National Blood Transfusion Guidelines"; finished anesthesiology residency at the University of Michigan Medical School in 2001, and worked in the Department of Anesthesiology, Northwest Memorial Hospital, Affiliated to Northwestern University Feinberg School of Medicine for 17 years before he served as the chair of the Department of Anesthesiology, Shanghai Jiahui International Hospital in 2018 and his current position at Ohio State University in the United States.

He won a number of awards including his most prestigious "International Anesthesia Research Society Outstanding Teaching Achievement Award" in 2013".
